NEW COMMUNICATION STRATEGY

At its May 2019 meeting the ACBM adopted a new wide ranging Communications Strategy. A compelling feature is the recognition that going forward the Mission's communications need to be more focused and accessible on smartphones. All areas of our communications, our monthly eNews, our Facebook and our Website will require significant development to achieve this. These changes will be progressively introduced over the next twelve to twenty four months. Instagram will also be embraced in a move to maximise the circulation of information.

Other proposed developments include updating our current website with a new homepage to include a marketing focus and a "call to action", seeking donations, recruiting fieldworkers and encouraging attendance at offshore Bible Schools. The upgraded site will enable several donation options to be used including productised donation categories.

Recent government registration of the Bangladesh Christadelphians has meant much work for local brothers in setting up a Trust for handling foreign money. Slowly they (and the ACBM) are coming to grips with the new requirements and the need for everyone to work together.

During the year a combined CYC camp near Dhaka brought together 40 young people from all over the country and they benefited from the studies given by visiting speakers.

The ecclesias now look forward to the annual Bible School in August 2019 It is encouraging to have up to ten friends, both young and old attending baptism classes.

Brother Stephen Murie spent 6 months in Bangladesh guiding and assisting the brothers and sisters through a difficult period. The assistance of more field workers would be greatly appreciated.


An excited Mymensingh Ecclesia recently baptised 4 contacts in one day using a coffin as a baptismal bath. This ecclesia now numbers 12, all young men. However it serves to exacerbate the increasing difficulty of the young brothers finding suitable help meets.

Personal Mission Story

One very enthusiastic young brother, currently working in Savar near Dhaka, is keen to have an ecclesia in his hometown, about a 7 hour bus trip away in the NNW of Bangladesh. He is much encouraged by nine of his interested friends attending the CYC camp and later when about 30 friends, attended a preaching effort in his hometown. One 14 year old Dhaka girl, a sister's unbaptized daughter has it seems, unassisted, started her own weekly "Christadelphian" Sunday School Class with around 7 children!

As noted last year, the rise in Hindu nationalism has increased, which can make preaching Christianity difficult particularly in the north of India. In spite of these difficulties, the ACBM area teams continue to work with the local ecclesias to effectively preach the gospel.

In south India there are teams for Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, plus Kerala.

In north east India another team supports the ecclesias in West Bengal and the states to the east of Bangladesh. Another team works in the North, North Central and North West of the country. Where possible these teams work together across areas. The brothers and sisters and young people appreciate the regular Bible weeks, sisters gatherings, elders' meetings and youth camps and all are encouraged to attend at least one such activity each year for fellowship and Bible study. Speakers at activities include visitors from western countries and many local speakers.

Why not consider attending one of the Bible weeks, Youth camps or preaching truth camps. Visits can be as short as a week or two. Or if you have the time available, a longer visit of a few months based in one of the many Mission flats which can act as a base for visiting and supporting local ecclesias.

Kerala floods



22,000 people dislocated by Kerala floods

Welfare needs are growing and sometimes can require an immediate and large scale response (see Kerala Flood report) as well as help for individual cases of illness. There are also many charitable activities run by Christadelphian entities where the ACBM works in conjunction with them.

There is a role for anyone who wants to be involved in the preaching and pastoral work. If you want more information on how to be involved contact india@acbm.org.au and bro Graham Reeve will direct you to the appropriate area team leader.

Kerala Floods

Kerala State is located in the lower south west corner of India and is wedged between the ocean and the Western Ghats Mountains. In normal times Kerala is a wonderland of rivers and backwaters. However, in July 2018 the heaviest monsoon rains in a century caused extensive damaging floods and landslides. 483 people died, over one million people were displaced, huge areas were flooded including agricultural land, houses flooded and extensively damaged, airports closed and roads and rail lines submerged. Some of our Kerala brothers and sisters fled their home with only the clothes they were wearing as their houses were flooded

The ACBM via a special financial appeal together with ecclesias in India provided immediate welfare assistance to brothers and sisters and others in various villages. School materials for 500 children were collected. 50 kitchen kits with a blanket in each kit were also prepared. Brothers and sisters and young people from Hyderabad ecclesia plus the Christadelphian Shunem and Moinabad Homes drove the long distance to Kerala.

They visited two isolated villages near Tiruvella and distributed family packs of cooking and serving vessels. One village was reached on rowing boats because the houses were on small islands in the middle of paddy fields filled with water. The men were engaged in repairing damaged houses and the women cooked the food on the shore and sent the food on the boats. Five Government schools which were flooded were visited. The teachers and students were so happy to meet the team and the study materials were distributed to needy students selected by the teachers. The team also had provided detergents and disinfectant liquids which were given to the families and schools. Another school was selected where our bro. Joseph of Thrissur works. 170 students were given study materials and sanitary items for their personal use.

Personal Mission Story

This year we witnessed the Baptism of two contacts bringing the number in the Delhi area to 4. Many overseas brothers travel to Delhi on business, and while travel time to combined monthly memorial meetings is long, they are happy to travel to Delhi from around U.P. if ever you have the opportunity to go!

NORTH INDIA

Growth in North India is severely impacted by Hindu fundamentalism. Uttar Pradesh has the largest population in India and one of the key states for the BJP central government and its paramilitary wing, the RSS whose key political platform is the assertion of Hindu superiority over other religious minorities, particularily Christians and Muslims.

Despite few brothers, regular Bible Truth Camps are held in 4 states. An annual Bible week is held in June in the picturesque heights in the Himalayas at Mussoorie, Uttarakhand attended by around 75, including interstate brothers and sisters. Members are scattered in 4 locations, but a regular combined Memorial meeting and Bible class is held monthly.

There are two places in homes of families in U.P. that can provide accommodation for fieldworkers.



Members of 7 ecclesias meet at least weekly for Memorial meetings, Bible study and first principles teaching. There are also a number of members in isolated villages. Sunday School work continues in some areas. Active preaching by local brothers has resulted in us being blessed with 20 baptisms mainly at Agartala and Sarenga ecclesias and there are good prospects for further baptisms in the near future.

Some highlights of the year have been:

- The annual West Bengal Bible School with studies on Philippians and Proverbs by brothers
- Jack and Andrew Lawson and a variety of topics by local brothers.
- A 2-day workshop for brothers by Bro. Tim Galbraith "Servants not Masters" in March 2019 for 12 brothers to develop their skills in leadership and service of the ecclesias.
- Visits to ecclesias by fieldworkers for Bible studies and fellowship.

More fieldworkers are needed to help with pastoral care, preaching and the encouragement of godly growth in our brothers and sisters. Visits can be made at the Bible School, Youth Camp or at any other time. Why not visit them this year? – you will be very warmly welcomed by our Bengali brothers and sisters.

Acbm.org.au provides access to all ACBM resources including the fieldworker guidebook and application forms plus more detailed and accurate information regarding the mission regions, the ecclesias and the activities of the local brethren and sisters.

Some information is accessible only to confirmed Christadelphians so you will need to register a user account.

In particular, the website is intended to provide a better historical overview of ecclesial growth within the specific regions, but remains a work in progress.

CRISIS MANAGEMENT

The ACBM has in place a Crisis Management Team (made up of the Secretary as Crisis Co-ordinator, the Chairman, the Insurance Officer and the Fieldworker Safety Officer) which can respond to a major crisis beyond the capacity of an ACBM Area Team and its ACBM Regional Committee.

A significant crisis did occur this year in Sri Lanka for our refugee brethren. It was handled by the Refugee Area Team which responds directly to the National Committee.

The crisis arose following the 21 April catastrophic bombings in Colombo and Negombo. Our refugee brethren were more directly affected as some locals turned on any and all Pakistani asylum seekers and refugees, assuming they were all involved. Our refugee brethren had to go into hiding as it was not safe for them to simply retreat to their homes which in some cases were looted or damaged. Food and fresh water were in short supply and it was unsafe for any Pakistani to be seen on the street.

Most of our refugee brethren were evacuated to a safe location until law and order were restored. The ACBM launched an appeal to assist in covering the cost of this temporary accommodation, food and relocation costs. The situation remains uneasy and the future safety of Pakistanis in Sri Lanka is not clear. Please remember our refugee brethren in your prayers.

YOUTH INVOLVEMENT

Brothers and sisters of all ages can be involved in the work of the ACBM. This includes our young baptised members. Many of the countries in the Asia Pacific Region have fast growing populations with young people making up a large percentage and as a result many of the brothers and sisters and contacts are young people who appreciate the opportunity to mix with others in their age group who share their love for the things of God.

The Asia-Pacific Region is amongst the fastest growing areas of the world for internet access and the uptake of smart phones. Modern technology provides many opportunities for preaching, forming friendships and maintaining contact with Christadelphian Young People.

As a young person one of the best ways to get a taste of what is involved in becoming a fieldworker is to attend one of the many youth conferences or Bible Schools that are held in our region. Often visits to these Bible Schools can be combined with visits to nearby ecclesias.

Regular events for young people in the South Pacific are held in The Philippines, Vanuatu, Fiji and the Solomon Islands. These are ideal opportunities for young people to experience what it is like to travel as a fieldworker.

A large Youth Conference attended by almost 300 young people is held each odd year in the Philippines and the next is scheduled for December 2019. Those who visit for the conference are able to travel around in small groups before or after the conference and spend time in nearby ecclesias.

In this last year Youth Conferences and Bible Schools have been held in many locations including India, Sri Lanka, East Timor, Singapore and Cambodia, with more activities planned for the coming twelve months.



Fieldworker visits take place throughout the year attending Bible Schools, engaging in preaching work and visiting brothers and sisters in ecclesias or in isolation. Young people often form a valuable part of many of these teams and a large number of brothers and sisters in the ACBM are younger people. Being part of a fieldworker team and experiencing the faith of other young people and brothers and sisters in other parts of the world is an incredible experience for any young person who takes up the opportunity. To begin just take a look at the ACBM website or have a chat to someone who has been on Mission work to get started!


Our brothers and sisters in Nepal continue to preach the word of God to those who are listening. This year there was one baptism that was very significant. Just over 18 years ago a newborn baby girl was abandoned on the streets of Kathmandu. Brother Gopal and Sister Shanti found her and took her home and with their teenage sons made her a part of their family. Their home is also the home of the Dhumbarai ecclesia that has supported her as she has grown up and it is wonderful to see Leah has chosen to devote her life to following Christ through the waters of baptism this year.

Two of our younger brothers have left Nepal to work in Dubai. For many families this is the only way they can survive with the high cost of living in Nepal.

This year the ACBM has assisted many with welfare needs and as this report is being written Sister Chandra is in ICU after getting an infection after an operation. Plans are underway for this year's bible week. Looking back at last year's bible week one of the highlights was being able to extend fellowship to brethren from northern India. In the past brothers and sisters from Nepal have been able to visit India and attend bible weeks so it was nice to have some Indian brothers visit Nepal.

As many would know a worldwide appeal has gone out to assist the Chabahil ecclesia to try and raise funds as they search for suitable land to build a much needed new ecclesial home.

We also pray for the safe arrival of two more children from our sisters Srijanna and Bijya in the very near future.

Brother Tim on his recent trip to Pakistan to attend the Southern Bible Weeks reported that the political situation seemed less tense than on previous visits, but the religious tension remains on a high level. And still the gospel message is being heard.

The Pakistani ecclesias hold regular preaching activities such as Truth Camps. To prepare for these activities the ecclesias hold leadership and Prepare to Preach workshops. The result of this preparation is reflected in the number of people coming to the saving name of Christ. It seems that in the darkest parts of the world the light shines brightest.

In December CYC camps were held with great enthusiasm. However, they had to be held in three venues due to difficulties in finding a suitably large venue and one that would allow us to rent it. The main reason for this difficulty is that we don't accept the doctrine of the

trinity. The camps were attended by brother Mathew and two brethren from Korea who along with local brothers presented the studies.

Bible Weeks have been held in both the Karachi (Sindh) and Punjab areas. The Karachi area is divided into north and south. Due to venue capacity and costs we sadly have needed to limit the number of attendees. In the South Karachi Bible Week only a 100 could attend and in the north only 50. Those who attend share with the other members of their ecclesias the things they experience and learn while at Bible Week.

Sunday School work is growing and is aided by Sunday School notes now translated into the Urdu language. We can now get MP3 players, pre-loaded with the Bible in the local language which is helpful as there are many in Pakistan who cannot read.

Sri Lanka has experienced another active year. There are three ecclesial homes. The members from each of these ecclesias meet at the annual Bible School held during the Christmas period.

There is also active fellowship with Iranian and Pakistani refugee brothers and sisters. The Sunday School programs at each of the ecclesias is very active and well structured. It was delightful to be able to send two Sri lankan sisters to the Bangalore Bible Week in India in May.

The Sri Lankan brothers and sisters have been blessed over the last year with regular contact from visiting brothers and sisters and young people mainly from Australia.

This ongoing support through either personal visits or financial assistance is very much appreciated.

Personal Mission Story

Easter Weekend 2019 witnessed the horror of Islamic terrorist bombings in Colombo and Negombo. The local Negombo populace suspected it was the work of Islamist refugees. Consequently they wanted all refugees and asylum seekers removed from the area. This meant some of our refugee brothers and sisters found themselves forcibly evicted from rental accommodation and without a home for several weeks. Together with financial support from Australia during this crisis, the Sri Lankan brothers and sisters assisted in finding temporary accommodation for their refugee brothers and sisters. They also were able to negotiate with local authorities to confirm that our refugee brothers and sisters had nothing to do with the bombings and only met together for worship purposes.

THIS IS YOUR BIBLE

thisisyourbible.com

This is Your Bible is the preaching website supported by the Bible Missions in the United Kingdom (CBM), North America (CBMA), and the ACBM. Its main feature is the online Bible course facility with provision for online tutoring, but it also offers:

- A wide range of literature covering most subject
- A guestion and answer reference page
- A location map for finding ecclesias and Mission contacts around the world
- Monthly articles and user surveys
- Selected videos

The Bible study option offered online allows visitors to register as students and select a course to work through at their leisure. Once registered, students are assigned to a tutor who will work with the student as they progress through their course. There are currently 560 brothers and sisters who are registered as online tutors.

One of the underutilised features of thisisyourbible.com is the ability

for ecclesias or Mission teams to take control of the students in a specified area and manage their progress with designated tutors. Using this feature means that the result of any specific advertising will come back to those who have advertised in the first place. By this means an ecclesia or Mission group can build up a base of online contacts each with a direct link to a tutor. They also have the ability to bulk mail the students in their area and monitor the progress of students.

The website now has an agile design which adapts to the needs of the increasing visitors using mobile devices which is especially the case in countries without a well developed telecommunications infrastructure, but is an increasing trend worldwide.

"This is your Bible" in the Northern Pacific Area

Because preaching of the Gospel had not been undertaken in the Northern Pacific area by the ACBM, it was decided by the SA Regional Committee to commence advertising through the website www.thisisyourbible.com This area includes the countries of Guam, Kiribati, Micronesia, Northern Mariana Islands, Nauru, Palau and the Marshall Islands.



FIELDWORKER SAFETY

During the year, many brothers and sisters have undertaken fieldwork in ACBM mission areas. We continue to pray for God's blessing and guidance in this important work.

Increasing unrest in many countries and the speed with which situations can change, reinforces concern for fieldworker safety. The Smart Traveller website run by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade provides important advice and warnings which are relevant for our fieldworkers. We ask fieldworkers to register for these notifications and to exercise due caution. Taking the advice of local brothers and sisters is also critical.



Applying in a timely way to be an ACBM fieldworker is important. This provides cover by the ACBM Insurance Policy which can assist fieldworkers practically if required. The fieldworker approval advice and emergency card includes information on action should an emergency occur.

The ACBM has special requirements for travel into areas classified as high risk (see the ACBM website). These measures are important parts of the Mission's duty of care for the safety and support of our fieldworkers.

On line advertising was commenced on 28th May 2018 using Google Ads placing them online using Bible based adverts.

One advert that has had a good consistent response is "Compare what your Church teaches with the Bible" which then leads them on to the "This is your Bible" website. Topical titles that are of interest in certain countries were used e.g., when promoting in the country of Guam, the following title on Google Ads "North Korea-USA the Bible has the answer" resulted in 532 visits to the "This is your Bible" website.

An Ad that produced many responses was "Who are the Christadelphians". Local print and digital newspapers have been used to advertise the website www.thisisyourbible. com Advertisements placed in these papers direct people interested in the Bible to our website.

In Kiribati, Google Ads as well as the local print and digital newspapers are being used on the theme of Noah's Ark as this country is only 3 metres above sea level and the people are concerned that with global warming their country will be completely inundated. Unfortunately, the Bible courses offered are often not completed and maybe 40 lessons are a bit daunting to start with.

The "Learn to read the Bible" video online Bible course that has 6 lessons, is now being offered hoping to encourage contacts to complete the full series of lessons. This form of promoting the Gospel will be continued before any fieldworker visits are undertaken.

FIELDWORKER TRAINING

It is important that all fieldworkers are well prepared before they visit a country and to assist with this several training presentations are available on the ACBM website. The ACBM would like to encourage ecclesias, CYCs or regions to make use of this material.

- The Everlasting Gospel a comprehensive 7-part Powerpoint presentation deals
 with issues such as why and how to preach, common questions, cultural issues and
 some of the challenges fieldworkers may face.
- **ACBM Fieldworker Induction Presentation** a presentation which can be worked through by individuals or small groups prior to leaving on a visit.

These presentations are in Powerpoint format and can be modified to suit different countries or planned activities.

Resources such as the workshop "Building Healthy Ecclesias", notes on the First Century Ecclesia and information on common beliefs that fieldworkers might encounter are also available to assist fieldworkers or ecclesias.

CHILD SAFETY

The safety of all children at ACBM activities in Australia, New Zealand and our Mission areas is very important to the ACBM.

The Mission's recently updated Child Safety Policy is available on the ACBM website and includes a number of important requirements. We are encouraging all Mission area ecclesias to adopt a similar policy to increase the awareness of child safety for the wellbeing of our young.

Child protection screening checks (different names in different jurisdictions) are required for all ACBM Committee members and fieldworkers. Each fieldworker's home ecclesia is also asked to confirm that they are not aware of any issue relating to the safety or welfare of children that would prevent the fieldworker doing ACBM work.

We are also asking any brother or sister who visits ACBM sponsored Bible weeks or activities in mission areas to obtain a screening check to ensure we as a brotherhood maintain a strong commitment to child safety.

The ACBM is also encouraging other Christadelphian organisations operating in ACBM areas to adopt similar processes and practices to ensure a consistent approach in this critical area.

By God's blessing we have continued to have an active and exciting presence in Cambodia for the last year. We are blessed to still have 4 main centers of activity, Siem Reap in the far North, Phnom Penh in the center along with Kampong Speu and Sihanoukville in the South. Each of these areas have an ecclesia and Sunday school and all have a Bible Education Center (BEC) apart from Kampong Speu.

The largest ecclesia is in Phnom Penh where we have, in the last few months, had to move our BEC to a new premises. The BECs continue to partner with other groups for the betterment of Cambodia, both through preaching the gospel and doing acts of charity. One of these projects is the Bethezer dorms in the capital which houses students from rural areas while they study. BEC fieldworkers visit and give bible lessons.

In Siem Reap, plans are underway for the construction of an ecclesial hall and bible education center by the Siem Reap hall project team. Land has already been purchased for this purpose. God willing once the funds have completely been raised a hall will be built at the start of next year on the ecclesial land. Having an owned building will allow the local brothers and sisters to be less reliant on funding from overseas.

In Kampong Speu there were 5 baptisms at the Christadelphian Cambodia Sustainability Project (CSP) this year. The project is also used as a base for Gospel extension and charity works in a very poor rural community. Fieldworkers go to the CSP to preach and meet with the small ecclesia there.

We always are in need for more field workers in Cambodia. We have many students waiting for lessons. Please consider a stay, if you can, to further God's great and exciting work happening in Cambodia.

Most Indonesian Christadelphians live in the city of Solo (also called Surakarta) in Central Java. Over 60 brothers and sisters make up the ecclesia and enjoy a range of activities including Memorial Meetings, Bible Classes, Sunday School, Sisters' Class, a youth group, and prayer meetings.

The annual Study Week in late June 2019 provided a great opportunity for learning and fellowship. The theme was "The Fruit of the Spirit" and Paul's important message was appreciated by all.

Study Week enabled Australian visitors to share in the excitement of the ecclesia with 4 baptisms, visits to the elderly, reconnecting with some not attending, and also visiting a brother living a distance from Solo. Unfortunately the Recorder, Bro Boby, was unable to attend most activities due to hospitalisation for his ongoing health condition. Year on year, we are finding the need to increase financial support for health issues in Solo.

There is also a small ecclesia in the capital, Jakarta, which meets as regularly as possible. The recent baptisms of three Iranian refugees living in Jakarta is a great source of joy.

Personal Mission Story

A highlight for Indonesia this year was the baptism of 3 Iranian refugees currently in Jakarta waiting resettlement. Two left Iran 6 years ago, while the third has been in Jakarta for 2 years. Christian persecution in Iran made them fearful for their lives so they fled to Indonesia. Their strong desire to find a community which did not believe in the Trinity and that saw the need to understand the Old Testament so as to appreciate the New, led them to Bro David Budiman. A long period of discussion with David culminated in their recent baptisms. They have fled from home and country. They cannot communicate with their families for fear of endangering them and they have left lives of comfort, wealth and security for the sake of the Gospel. A humbling and inspiring story.

They are often pleasantly surprised with the amount of Bible information on End Time prophecies and their close correlation with current world events.

Our current preaching campaign is at the midpoint of a 14-part series with ten interested friends remaining after six weeks. God willing, we pray their interest will be sustained as we enter the stage of "Detoxing false doctrines".



The very first thing to acknowledge is the wonderful support from many ecclesias in NSW and the Sydney CYC for their very generous financial donations for the work in the Philippines.

The highlights during this past year were two Family Fraternals (just like Bible Schools), one held in Mindanao (Northern Philippines) and the other in Luzon (Southern Philippines) and the Philippines CYC weekend.

Family Fraternals

These provide very important spiritual and social opportunities for the Filipinos and are thoroughly enjoyed. Often this is the only opportunity some have of meeting brothers and sisters from other Philippines Ecclesias.

In December 2018, around 500, including children, attended these gatherings. There were study sessions by visiting and local speakers and Sunday School activities for the children. At the Mindanao gathering the subject of the "Beatitudes" was led by Bro. David McClure and studies were also given by Bro Julius Bumadilla highlighting Bible characters where the Beatitudes are shown in practice. At the Luzon gathering the subject of "Ezra - Stirring up a people" was covered by Bro. James McCann as well as local brothers giving talks about various Bible characters. During the Luzon fraternal workshops covering Sunday School work, preaching methods, Bible classes and family daily Bible readings were held. A special evening session was held on "Developing a Spiritual Mind in a Technological World."

CYC Weekend

A CYC study weekend was held in April 2019 at the Bugallon ecclesial hall where 106 young people heard studies on "Philippians - Focusing on the Goal" by Bro. Kent Wilson. The amenities at Bugallon have been upgraded to cater for young people to hold CYC weekends there.



Personal Mission Story

A heart operation has changed the life of a young sister in the Philippines Sis Irene Tibay was suffering from a narrowing of the heart's mitral valve. As a result, the valve didn't open properly, blocking blood flow into the main pumping chamber of her heart (left ventricle). Mitral valve stenosis can make you tired and short of breath, among other problems. She required a non-invasive operation (as opposed to open heart surgery) known as percutaneous transvenous mitral commissurotomy (PTMC). Following an appeal to the brotherhood in NSW funds were obtained for surgery. Sis Irene underwent a successful operation in March 2019. In July 2019 her Manila doctors advised that her heartbeat was now normal and her heart rhythm was good. She is no longer tired when walking just a short distance as before. Sis Irene sends her thanks: "To all our brothers and sisters in Christ especially to the ACBM for all the support financially and for all the love, thoughts and prayers. On behalf of my family we are very thankful and really appreciate it more than words can say".



On reflection the growth of the truth in Fiji, and the impact of the gospel in the lives of the families in Fiji has been a work deeply blessed by our Heavenly Father. Today we witness Fijian brothers and sisters actively involved in ecclesias in Fiji, Australia, Canada and the USA. Some are now involved in mission areas in India, Solomon Islands, and other Pacific nations.

Fiji itself is becoming an increasingly important hub for many regional governments and is by far the most developed pacific island nation. These changes are bringing increasing lifestyle and spiritual challenges on the ecclesia and the young people.



PAPUA NEW GUINEA + BOUGAINVILLE

PNG is called 'the land of the unexpected'. Irregular transport, an ineffective communication system, local political pressures and issues of personal safety, have made visits to Bougainville impossible over the last 12 months. The brethren have asked that the ACBM keep out of Bougainville until after the forthcoming referendum for national independence in October 2019.



However, on a positive note a small group of local Bougainville brethren organised a successful youth gathering last January. Another is planned for the end of the year God willing.

Meanwhile in the corrupt city of Lae, Br Joachim continues to shepherd the small ecclesia and preach the Truth to friends and relatives.

The Father's hand is not shortened that it cannot save. Many on Goodenough Island (Milne Bay province) have been introduced to the Truth, primarily through the preaching of Br Steven Illewana – the

only brother on this remote Island. This isolated island has shown a thirst for Bible knowledge and 118+ are receiving instruction via the 'Let the Bible Speak' series of 40 lessons.

Personal Mission Story

When purchasing supplies for the camp a miscommunication occurred and twice as many toilet rolls as needed were purchased, an error which proved to be a blessing. Swathed in toilet paper, he made a very convincing Lazarus wrapped in grave clothes. The 130 children were delighted and not only learned about life in the Kingdom but also had a lesson in hygiene.

There has been continuing growth in the Solomon Islands with a further 8 baptisms this year. The recent baptisms have been family members of brothers and sisters.

Further improvements have been made to the BEC site at Fote to make

it more suitable to hold the annual Bible Weeks and youth gatherings. Ablution and toilet blocks and an additional dormitory with solar lighting has been built and a Sunday School room has been provided.

The local brothers, sisters and young people are delighted to have these opportunities to get together and enjoy fellowship around the word of God. Because the islanders are generally poor, the Mission pays the travel and food costs for those attending.

We attempt to have two other fieldworker visits each year so as to keep in touch every three months. Preaching work is concentrated in Honiara and in Malaita, where the larger ecclesias are established. The "Let the Bible Speak" radio programme is broadcast across the entire Solomon Islands through the Solomon Islands Broadcasting Corporation. This presents the gospel message to those we are unable to visit on the many scattered islands.

Bro Reuben has faithfully worked with the Ecclesia in Honiara. He ensures that the Memorial Meeting is held every Sunday even phoning the local brethren to remind them to attend.

Chillon was a pastor of the S.S.E.C for 20 years but came to realise that the church did not follow true Bible teaching. He would keenly contact fieldworkers during visits. Following the completion of the Bible Correspondence Course he was baptised.

Brother Chillion has made sure that his family received instruction from fieldworkers. His younger children and grandchildren have attended Sunday School. As a result of many years of faithful service, two of the sons and five of the daughters of Bro Chillion and Sis Grace Suiti have been baptised, together with a son-in-law and two daughters-in-law. Five of his grandchildren are already baptised and others are showing keen interest.

However, none can give up, for we know not how the hand of our God might work, thus on each visit back, contact is made. She is now married with 3 little boys of her own. By God's grace, some seed has been sown, and our prayer is that this family, might one day take on the true Hope of Israel.


