It has also allowed for the ongoing care and assistance in the day-to-day necessities of a significant number of refugee brothers and sisters in our area of activity.

Strategy & PLANNING

Report by Steve Dodson, ACBM Strategy and Planning

The ACBM has a simply stated mission that essentially includes three broad goals, those being: preach the Gospel, encourage ecclesial development, and provide welfare support where needed. Exactly how these goals are supported varies from region to region, and the ACBM continues to look for new opportunities to meet these goals in the Asia-Pacific region.

To support these goals the priorities over the last few years have been looking for greenfield areas to share the Gospel, working towards more mature ecclesias using "the ecclesial development model" as a guide, and supporting efforts through technology and other tools.

The Ecclesial Development model has been in use for some time and continues to be a useful tool to help Mission Area Teams consider the maturity level and specific needs of each ecclesia/group in the countries where we work. It helps identify focus areas for the future, but what are the opportunities and challenges we are facing as we look to the future?

We are currently in the process of collecting feedback that will inform us as to future direction. The ACBM National Committee used a large portion of our most recent meeting to consider strategy and how best we might continue to serve the Lord in this area of His work. During the balance of 2024 everyone will have the opportunity to respond to a survey or contact the ACBM directly to share their feedback. We will be looking at: "What is going well and is working, and we should do more of"; "What is not going so well and needs improvement"; "What is getting in the way"; and "Are there new ideas that could make a big difference?".



Afghanistan

Due to persecution the brothers and sisters are scattered in several locations across a number of countries. They often move as they feel threatened, and seek a safer place. A majority are living as undocumented refugees, while some families are registered with the UNHCR as asylum seekers, but have not had their cases processed to gain official refugee status. The ACBM has rented accommodation in several places to provide accommodation. About 40% are totally dependent on ACBM welfare, while another 40% are partially so. During the year two brothers were shot and killed in separate incidents, while several sisters were seriously molested before reaching safety. Members are strong in faith, meeting daily for readings, and weekly for worship when possible. We rejoice in the 44 baptisms of this past year.

Bangladesh

The ecclesias continue to face the challenge of poor attendance at the memorial meetings. This is particularly due to a lack of active brothers. The central Dhaka Ecclesia continues to meet in the apartment rented by Bro Ron Hicks which also provides comfortable living quarters for field workers.

The Savar Ecclesia can meet in an apartment at the Christadelphian school, and field workers can be accommodated there. The operation of the school continues to benefit the ecclesia.

The Mymensingh Ecclesia has been provided with funds to build a substantial apartment and they are able to meet there. There is an active Sunday School in Radhagonj some 3 hours from the central ecclesia at Dhaka.

Savar ecclesia continues using the Christadelphian Children's Service School facilities. Some Bangladesh brothers and sisters join in West Bengal's weekly zoom Bible study which is translated into Bengali. Currently only a few Bangladeshi attend but it does hold out some promise for the future.


The first Bible School since COVID is being organized in October and it is hoped it will be a stimulus to ecclesial activity.

A sister's house in Savar was flooded in recent floods and she had to be temporarily relocated to the ecclesial apartment. Recent riots completely disrupted internet connections and local banking and normal communications were disrupted.

The population of India is over 1.4 billion and this provides a wonderful base for spreading the Gospel. However, challenges include the national government's Hindu agenda which can lead to anti-Christian and anti-Muslim sentiment. Restrictions on sending foreign money to India continue. Ecclesias continue to recover from the pandemic with an increased number of Bible camps and events.

South India (Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala)

As in other areas in India with a Christadelphian presence, the post COVID period has seen local brothers and sisters continue to take increasing responsibility for the preaching and pastoral work. In Kerala the brethren of the Trivandrum Ecclesia take on much of the responsibility for pastoral care of the smaller ecclesias in that area. A very successful All Kerala Bible Camp was held at Angamally from May 15 to 19. Studies were led by brethren from Australia and India. **Four baptisms** of young people from Kulamavu Ecclesia took place at the Camp to the great joy of all.

Fieldworker visits from February to May covered much of Karnataka and Tamil Nadu, giving pastoral support and studies across the ecclesial areas. The visits, guidance and encouragement were very much appreciated. An increase in regular pastoral visits from the major ecclesias in the southern states to smaller outlying groups is being planned.

The usual much anticipated South India Bible Week was held early in May and was hosted by the Bangalore Ecclesia at the Claret Nivas venue. Studies were led by brothers from the USA, Australia and the local area. Attendees returned home encouraged and excited.

Bro T V George, who for over thirty years has faithfully translated and distributed the Isolation League papers to our Malayalam speaking brethren, has finally passed the baton to younger brethren. A prominent Catholic priest in his younger days, he was introduced to the things of the Kingdom and of the Lord Jesus by a nun. They both subsequently wrote to Rome, absolved their vows, were baptised, and later married. Sis Annie passed away in January 2023 after a faithful pilgrimage of 35 years. Bro George continues as a strong supporter of all ecclesial activities he can attend. We thank him for his thousands of hours in translating, printing and mailing out the exhortations and other material every week for so many years.

Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, West India

The past year has seen continued active preaching work by the local brothers and sisters, with Ecclesias taking on responsibility for interecclesial planning, pastoral visits by local brethren, and new local preaching initiatives. Particularly encouraging has been younger brethren taking on these responsibilities with the passing on of older brethren. One of the initiatives has been holding classes that focus on teaching independent church pastors the Bible truth. These have been carried out by brethren of Tangatur Ecclesia in Prakasam Dt, and brethren of Kadiam Ecclesia in EG District tribal regions. Like Apollos of old, there are many sincere preachers who need to be instructed in "the way of God more perfectly". These regular classes led to ten baptisms at Kadiam in June this year.

This year saw the passing of Bro Daniel P James at 90 yrs of age. He was a key figure in the preaching work in Andhra Pradesh over the past 32 years. Convinced sixty years ago from his own Bible study, of the oneness of God, and of the Bible teaching concerning Christ, he established several unitarian congregations, before finally finding the Christadelphians in 1992. His excellent Bible knowledge, his clear expositions and translation in an expressive tone, his strong vibrant singing voice, all made him a significant figure at Bible Camps, Bible Weeks and Ecclesial gatherings until age slowed him down two or three years ago. This year the Adoni Ecclesia held a special weekend, with visiting speakers from Hyderabad Ecclesia, to celebrate 30 years of their Ecclesia. Well over 30 years ago, a recent convert in Hyderabad Ecclesia (now settled in Perth) witnessed to his cousin, an independent village preacher, V. Anand. Soon he was Bro Anand, a tireless preacher to one and all, with an excellent Bible knowledge and vigorous style. He passed away a few years ago, but the Adoni Ecclesia lives on as a testament to his hard work, with the majority of the current members being the fruit of his labours.

Personal Mission Story

North East India

There are several northeastern states in India, but Christadelphians are only found in West Bengal and Tripura. There are 5 ecclesias in West Bengal and two small groups in Tripura. Our brothers and sisters preach as they can.

Bible Camps took place in October 2023 in the town of Sarenga in West Bengal, and in March 2024 in Agartala, the capital of Tripura. Over recent years, the West Bengal Bible School has been held in the October holidays with brothers, sisters and contacts attending from all over the southern and western parts of the state. Brothers and sisters normally meet in small ecclesias or live in isolation, so the annual camp is a very welcome event. At the camp in October 2023, two baptisms added to our brethren's joy of fellowship. A camp was held in Tripura in March 2024 and gratefully attended by a small group of believers in and around Agartala with talks given over Zoom and translated into Bengali by bro Sourav Mondal.

Manju Barik who lives near Contai in West Bengal, was baptised in 2001. We don't know what her husband thought when she was baptised, or even whether he attended her baptism. That was several years before we began visiting West Bengal as a family. What we do know is that Sukumar came along with her to the West Bengal Bible School at Sarenga in October 2023, and was determined to be baptised. He is an outgoing, dynamic man, with a big smile to match his wife's. As we talked to him, he was quick to laugh about how foolish he had been in not listening to Manju earlier. When given an opportunity to confess his faith, he told us enthusiastically and at length what he believed – explaining why in the process. And so, on a hot, sunny day, in a large pond in an idyllic country setting, sis Manju's patient, 22-year wait was over as her husband Sukumar became her brother in Christ as well. Now they can wait together patiently for Jesus' return and walk together in faith.

On the same afternoon, another new sister was also baptised who had been waiting patiently herself. Sister Nilima Ghosh (daughter of bro Badal Ghosh) first expressed a desire to be baptised ten years ago and her desire and understanding have been growing since then. Her father has been attending such camps for many years and is now an old man who was not well enough to join us this time. However, he made sure that his daughter could attend and her first words to us at the camp were (in Bengali), "I want to be baptised." Two new believers were welcomed into our fellowship with joy and singing that sunny afternoon.

Nepal

Punjab

Through the blessing of our Father and the tireless zeal of our local brothers and sisters, the gospel continues to prosper in the Punjab region of Pakistan. 381 baptisms during the year brought Punjab's total to 1316 members in 73 ecclesias at the end of June 2024.

Family Bible Camps & Youth Conferences

Due to limited accommodation at the Bible camp venue, located in the cooler mountainous region of North Punjab, it was decided to have 2 back-to-back camps, allowing 500 brothers and sisters and around 100 children the wonderful opportunity to experience the joy of fellowshipping together. Brothers David Mansfield and Matthew Jamieson gave the same studies at both camps, on the apostle John and Joseph, with afternoon activities including a hands-on craft project to create a butterfly from a caterpillar, impressively illustrating the spiritual transformation which must take place in all of us. (Romans 12:2)

In December 2023, 270 young people from all over the Punjab attended the 3-day youth conference. "The Angels of God" was the theme, and takehome workbook notes were prepared in Urdu based on Bro Ron Cowie's Bible marking notes. Studies were held in the mornings, discussion groups each afternoon, and the young people really enjoyed the evening Q&A sessions using the "Kahoot" App.

First Principles, Sunday School Notes & Hymn Books

Translation and printing of first principles courses continues, including an expanded version of the CBM 19 lesson course, the CBM 22 course, a 15 Lesson bible prophecy course, and a Baptism Q&A with 88 questions. Currently a "Life of Jesus" in 30 studies is being compiled and translated. To keep up with the growing number of ecclesias, 1500 more Urdu hymnbooks were printed, and 200 more CSSA Primary Notes (5-8) in Urdu were printed – all 5 stages – 100 copies for Punjab and 100 copies for Sindh.

Sunday School News.

72 Sunday Schools had great end-of-year celebrations. The annual party is a rare and exciting treat for them. We can't show all Sunday Schools – but here are just two.

In October 2023 our ecclesia at Dadfatihana faced a difficult situation. Preaching began there 3 ½ years ago and there are now 40 baptised brothers and

sisters. The building where they were meeting, was being sold.

(Includes the provinces of Sindh, Balochistan and Kyber Pakhtunkhwa) With public buildings not available for rent as places for Christian worship, and most members having very small homes, the provision of an ecclesial hall once numbers grow, is imperative.

In Karachi the Kath Goth Ecclesia built their small meeting place this year on donated land for A\$2200.

Three local

ecclesias held special collections and met 30% of the cost, leaving 70% to come from ACBM funds. All labour was provided free by the local brothers. The Bhutto Colony Ecclesia also rejoiced in a new hall with a special Bible Study Day, using local speakers, and an overseas speaker online.

Building up the spiritual house is of course more important, so in addition to the weekly meetings and classes, the two annual Bible Weeks for the Karachi Region ecclesias are a highlight. The five-day Bible Weeks are intensive study times, with 5 studies of an hour each, plus the daily readings and 2 activity sessions each day, except for an outing day midweek. The brethren like to be well organized so for the Bible Week there is a Program Co-ordinator, then separate committees for Finance, Medical, Printing, Transport Booking, Travelling Sector Rosters, Media, and Catering. The 24-hour train journey, away from Karachi's scorching summer to the Himalayan foothills, is divided into 8 sectors of 3 hours each, with two brothers and two sisters rostered for each sector to ensure everyone has access to drinking water, chai, milk for babies, etc.

With up to 200 brothers and sisters and family members on the train, it is a major operation to ensure all have a comfortable journey and then a 4hour bus journey. Six days later the whole operation is repeated to ensure all reach home safely. At the end of the journey, they thank the Father that they have been able to bring home a small, lingering taste of the Kingdom.

The year started well with a week of sisters' activities around fieldworker sisters visiting from Australia and India. The main beneficiaries were refugee sisters as they were free during the week, but Sri Lankan sisters were able to attend over the weekends.

A fieldworker visit late in 2023, witnessed several baptisms. Life is still difficult for many Sri Lankans following COVID, and the devastating economic collapse which followed. It remains hard for many to get work which pays for the basic bills. The economy seems to be slowly recovering, but there is not much money around, and the effects of inflation still ravage commerce and persecute the poor particularly.

As a consequence, there is still a need for some welfare to help brothers and sisters put food on the table. The response to these needs has been heartwarming. Brothers and sisters in Australia have extended their support to provide basic needs. At the end of year Bible School, many brothers and sisters expressed their heartfelt appreciation for the support that had been given to them. Some had their lives saved by timely intervention and the provision of medical support. Brothers and sisters, often with tears in their eyes, quietly wanted to pass on their humble thanks, to brothers and sisters in Australia, for what had been done for them.

Annual Bible School

The annual Bible School was held in January 2024, rather than the usual December. It proved to be a stimulating event that was enjoyed by the 90 attendees, including children, visiting Australians and interested friends. The speaker, Bro Russell Taylor, brought a large cohort of family and other young people with him, and they not only enjoyed the activity but were an encouragement to the local brothers and sisters and young people. The studies, on True Discipleship of Jesus, taken from Mark, were much appreciated. There were some follow up activities with the young people after the school.

Refugee area team

The ACBM continues to provide both physical and spiritual support for refugee brothers and sisters living in a number of our mission areas. The Christadelphian Refugee Assistance Council (CRAC) is also continuing their work to find ways to resettle refugee brethren into Australia wherever possible.

Please remember all our refugee brothers and sisters in your prayers.

Sri Lanka

The plight of our refugee brethren living in SL has been very tumultuous and stressful over the past year. UNHCR made the decision to close its office in Sri Lanka and accept no further applications by those seeking asylum. As part of their closure activities, it appears the UNHCR took the approach of issuing 'rejection letters' to most refugees leaving them with no option but to return to their home countries. Their lives were thrown into disarray with only a few weeks to voluntarily depart or else remain in Sri Lanka as illegal overstayers with the high risk of being detained and then formally deported.

One family, a brother, his wife and young son, were arrested and had the harrowing experience of being in separate areas of Immigration's detention centre for over a month. The trauma of their experience was heart rending. Eventually, by God's grace, negotiations led to their release and immediate, but safe, exit from the country.

Of those refugee families in our care in Sri Lanka, we have funded the airfares of 33 individuals to return to

either Pakistan or Iran. Mercifully, all were able to pass safely through immigration with minimal harassment. Now, only a very small number of our refugees remain in Sri Lanka.

We are deeply grateful and indebted to the support of our wider family in Christ to be able to aid our brothers and sisters during this time. The Refugee Area Team has been actively facilitating the support and resettlement of returnees, both practically and spiritually by connecting them to local members and ecclesias where possible

Afghanistan

Our prayers continue for our brothers and sisters facing such extreme persecution for their faith. More information is included in the Afghanistan report.

Indonesia

Three Christadelphian refugees have lived in Jakarta for some years, a married couple, and a single brother. It is now 20 years since the word of God was first taught in Timor Leste and it continues to spread in this South East Asian country. It is very encouraging to see the work being done in Liquica, about 25 km west of Dili, particularly by sister Agostina (Tina). She is a teacher and well-known for her faith in the community. She left the Catholic Church some years ago because she found its teaching inconsistent with the Bible. Timor Leste is 99% Catholic and there is some opposition. However, Sis Tina has established a Sunday School for many local children and she runs a Bible class for interested neighbours and friends. Memorial meetings are held in her house. The possibility of purchasing land and erecting a hall in Liquica are being investigated.

There are also Sunday Schools in Dili and in Hera, the work of Sis Matilda.

Twenty years ago, preaching in Timor Leste was done by fieldworkers but now it is carried out by locals in their own language.

Cambodia

The last 12 months of activity in Cambodia have been very positive. We have had two long term Fieldworkers living and teaching in the Phnom Penh Bible Education Centre (BEC). Brother Jonathan David from India came in Feb 2023 and Bro Zac Forbes from NZ came in September 2023. They are both doing a wonderful work spreading the gospel message.

The highlight of the year was the Bible School in December 2023. We received great support from international visitors, with 43 brothers and sisters and young people, mostly from Australia, attending. They joined by 32 local brothers and sisters and around 90 local young people and Bible students. All up there were over 160 people at the Bible School. It was held at a beautiful Christian camp site called Shalom Valley, which is near the coastal town of Kep. It's surrounded by tree covered hills and natural water features. Everyone had a wonderful time and they strengthened or built friendships and were very much spiritually recharged.

During the Bible School we had the baptisms of two of our Sunday School Students, Bro Reachea and Sis Saron. There have been 5 baptisms in the last 12 months in the mercy of our Father in heaven.

In June 2024, Brother Ethan Tunstall also joined the BEC fieldworking team. He came for the Bible School at the start of the year, saw the work that was being done, and decided he wanted to come back to help out with teaching. So currently we have 3 long term fieldworkers living in our Bible Education Centre in Phnom Penh, teaching both Bible and English.

Our Christadelphian Dormitory Project is going well. We have a boys' dormitory and a girls' dormitory with

up to 40 university aged students, often from poorer areas of Cambodia, who come to Phnom Penh to study. We provide them a safe and comfortable place to live. They are encouraged to do at least 4 hours of Bible lessons a week. There are 4 dormitory students currently going through for baptism which is really encouraging.

Mission story

In our ongoing preaching projects in Cambodia, there's an inspiring development in Trepang Prasat, a small village a few hours north of Siem Reap. Brother Sophorn, a former dormitory student, and his wife have been actively sharing the gospel message with his colleagues. Their efforts have led to the formation



A small group of brothers and sisters live in or around the capital, Jakarta. It is a vast city, and some are only there part-time, so breaking of bread meetings are spasmodic.

Most activity in Indonesia centres on Solo, also called Surakarta, in Central Java. A very active ecclesia of about 60 members meets there. Solo has a full range of activities: weekly memorial meetings, Sunday School, youth meetings; a monthly Bible Class and Sisters' Class. They also seize every opportunity to solidify the ecclesia with activities on national holidays, so they remain a tight knit group in such a large and mainly Muslim country.

A Study Week is held yearly in June or early July, with 3 or 4 evening studies at the Solo hall, and an overnight away visit at Tawangmangu, about 1.5 hours from Solo.

This is an enjoyable time of fellowship, Bible learning, and fun for all. The subject in June 2024 was "Knowing Jesus – the Son of God". This gave a broad overview of Jesus, including his birth, his ministry (teachings, parables, and healing), his death, resurrection and ascension, and his role now. It was well received and prompted many questions and good discussion among the group.

2 Solo young people were baptized on the Sunday prior to Study Week, and their interest and involvement in Study Week activities was particularly noted. Solo has a very moving way of welcoming new members. A group of brothers and sisters representing different ages, backgrounds and nationalities (if overseas visitors are present) are called to the front to join the new member. Each brother and sister places their hands on the hands of the newly baptized brother and sister as a symbol of the unity we have as members of Jesus' international family. Something for your ecclesia to consider!

In February, a Study Day, which began very early with breakfast together, included 3 studies on "The Angels - God's Messengers". An important and critical subject, which focused attention on God's involvement in our lives, and also the nations we live in.

There has been significant focus this past year on developing and encouraging younger members to take a more active role. It is great to see the impact of this on Solo Ecclesia, and we thank God for his blessings.

Samantha was baptised in December 2023. The baptismal exhortation was given by Bro Clem and Sis Kay Wigzell who met with Samantha some 20 years earlier. 19th Biennial Philippine Youth Conference

The highlight of the 2023/24 year was the 19th Biennial Philippine Christadelphian Youth Conference (PCYC), which was held on 25-29 December 2023. While this is a once in every two-year event, this was the first face to face youth conference in four years because of the pandemic.

The conference was held at Tarlac Agricultural University in central Luzon, the main northern island of the Philippines. About 220 young people coming from 20 Philippine ecclesias attended. This included about 90 young people from Mindanao (the main southern island of the Philippines), the island of Cebu and the island of Negros. Some young people travelled for more than 12 hours by bus to get to the conference venue. The were several overseas visitors that also attended as well as the Filipino hosts.

Bro Kent Wilson (Hyde Park Ecclesia) led the studies on "Fruit of the Spirit ... our journey toward Christlikeness". The studies were clearly presented in a way the young people could understand and were well received. Each study was followed by discussion groups to enhance what was learned in the talks. There were 10 discussion groups in all. Each young person was assigned their group number at the beginning of the conference. This was to ensure that the discussion groups consisted of young people coming from a mix of ecclesias. An assigned young Filipino brother led the discussion groups.

The were also afternoon talks, "From the ashes – the miraculous birth of the nation of Israel" led by Bro Judah Martin, "The sons of Korah - Standing with the Father" led by Bro Peter Jolly and "Shechem – the place of decision and commitment". The evenings included socialization (1st evening), talks by young Filipino brothers and a song and praise evening.

The afternoons also included games (Filipino style) and sports (basketball and volleyball). The 10 discussion groups became teams for the games and sports competition. The games and sports were enjoyed by all and enthusiastically engaged in.

It was a full program, but it was an enjoyable, memorable and spiritually profitable time for all. For the Filipino young people, especially those who come from small and isolated ecclesias, the studies, the discussions and the fellowship with other young people are a great source of encouragement to their faith as they go forward to meet the challenges of this present world, waiting for the return of Christ.

The following note from a young Filipino sister ably reflects the sentiments of many young people who attended the Youth Conference:

The 2023 Philippine Christadelphian Youth Conference was truly memorable, with a standout moment being the impactful study led by our speaker. The phrase "Integrity is doing the right thing when no one is watching" resonated deeply, serving as a lasting reminder to uphold honesty and righteousness, knowing that God is always our unseen witness. I look forward to PCYCs, anticipating the opportunity to connect with fellow youth from diverse ecclesias, forge meaningful friendships, and immerse myself in the enlightening teachings of God's word. With hope, the next PCYC will be held in the Kingdom.

2024 Luzon CYC Study Weekend

Another young people's event was held in July (15-17/7/24). The Luzon CYC Study Weekend was held at the Bugallon Ecclesial Hall. About 125 young people attended from 12 ecclesias in Luzon, some travelling for more than 12 hours via public transport. The studies were led by Bro Julius Bumadilla and based on the gospel of Luke under the theme of "Jesus Christ – one man for all men". The studies outlined some of the themes that are peculiar to Luke's record and the relevant lessons that can be learned from them. Young Filipino brothers also gave meditation talks.

The young people were divided into four groups and each practised and sang with feeling an item for the Praise Night on Day 2 of the program. The same groups did one of the daily readings together on the mornings of Day 2 and 3. Question prompts were provided to aid the discussion on the readings.

On the afternoon of Day 2 the young people were transported in five jeepneys to the beach at Lingayen. The four assigned groups were given the task of making something in the sand to represent the future glory of the Kingdom. Another competition to encourage active participation was a prize for the tidiest dormitory room!

It is traditional at the end of a combined event in the Philippines for some of the brothers to give a short parting message. All expressed their appreciation of the event and for what they had learned from the studies.

Improvements to the Bugallon Ecclesial Hall, the usual venue for Luzon CYC events, have been recently completed to improve the facilities for accommodation for CYC events including the fabrication of about 20 double deck double beds

Membership numbers have been steady with 11 baptized (since Matthew Ng moved to Melbourne and left the truth sadly). The most recent focus has been on personal preaching and Facebook activity. We undertook a 6month prayer challenge to pray for the health and expansion of the ecclesia and for preaching success. We have definitely seen a marked uplift in visiting brothers and sisters for which we are grateful. We have continued collaboration with KL and HK Ecclesias. On the first Sunday of each month, we hold a combined 3-way Zoom memorial meeting with a rotating chair among the 3 ecclesias and the speakers provided by Victoria.

One concern is that our young people have no contact with other young people in the truth. Cooper Ross, a young brother from NSW, visited Singapore a few months back and suggested setting up a pen-pal type connection for our young people. However, getting them to physically attend events would be better in the long run. We are open to ideas here.

Penang and Fellowship Study Weekend 2025

In 2023 a joint KL/Sg initiative saw around 15 of our Singapore and KL brothers and sisters meet for study & fellowship in KL with Bro Peter Knowles speaking. This year we opted to move the location to Penang Island (Malaysia) and engaged bro David Edwards (Vic) to speak on "Principles of Preaching". Around 40 of us gathered in Penang on 9-11 August for a truly uplifting and inspiring weekend with practical and challenging studies and opportunities to meet and bond with brothers and sisters from all around the region.

I think the event opened the eyes of many of us that there is a great benefit from pursuing more active fellowship and cooperation between countries and Ecclesias. Contact between many of the attendees is being continued through a chatgroup and important contacts and relationships built.

We plan (God willing) to repeat the Penang Fellowship and Study Weekend in 2025 with more advanced planning, advertising and hopefully funding.

We will consider (and ACBM inputs are welcome here) how we can extend this into more of a youth event in view of the concerns shared above.

Thailand

The Thailand Learning Centre is a facility and teaching method that brings a number of students together with teachers for instruction in the Bible and a range of other subjects.

Teaching programs are designed to run for a few days or up to a few months. Programs involving up to 15 students for as long as 2 months have been run over the second half of 2023 and the first half of 2024.

For Somchai, hearing the Bible taught in a great deal of detail was something entirely new. Day after day, for several weeks, he heard passage after passage of the Bible clearly explained. This was a novel experience for this young Lahu man. From a small farming village in north-eastern Chiang Mai Province, Somchai spent about 3 months at the ACBM's Thailand Learning Centre, near Chiang Mai.

With up to 15 other students, most of them young, village people like himself, Somchai learned about the Bible, and among other subjects, received English-language instruction, learned about Christian values and how to live and think like someone who believes in the God of the Bible.

Bible subjects have included the person and purpose of the Lord Jesus Christ, God's plan of redemption, the kingdom of God and a range of Bible themes. Other subjects are designed to teach godly values or to skill up students in employable competencies. The former include such subjects as morals and conscience, and self-image and relationships. The latter include English-as-a-second-language, basic computing and barista training.

This "hybrid" method of meeting, befriending and teaching the gospel and other practical subjects to new friends has proven to be successful over a 12month period. In fact, during that time, two of the attendees of the program requested baptism. One of them was Somchai. After a serious discussion with him involving his "big" brother, Bro Ebenezer, who is of the same ethnicity as Somchai, a period of intense preparation followed, with the joyous occasion of his baptism coming shortly afterward.

The Thailand Learning Centre is a labour-intensive operation. Program attendees and teachers live at the facility for the duration of classes and activities. A typical day for 6 days of the week is about 10 to 12 hours long though well-timed breaks allow attendees and teachers some time to relax.

To continue the Centre into 2025, we are looking for more volunteers and teachers. If you are able to help, please contact Bro Terry Nutter at <u>bibledctr@gmail.com</u>. May our Heavenly Father continue to grant His blessings upon this initiative.

Our area is slowly recovering from COVID and the problems caused by restrictions on travel associated with meeting together in each of the ecclesias. Some members who disappeared in that time have returned but many are uncontactable by phone or any other method.

Our main method of preaching has continued. We have Bibles in Vietnamese and quite a number of Christadelphian books which have been translated and printed with official approval. The most useful publication has been a full translation of the Union Sunday School notes – a total of over 3,500 pages – and this has official approval.

Reports from SOUTHEAST ASIA

Our members are able to meet around a communal meal. (All church services in Vietnam must be conducted in recognized churches by law.) In some areas our members are restricted to no more than 12 attending a gathering. An ecclesia might therefore need to have up to 4 separate meetings in different sites each week, especially in country areas.

Each ecclesia is provided with funds to cover a meal together when they meet. Brothers and sisters often

bring interested friends who are provided for and the Sunday School children also bring their friends. For us this is an effective way to introduce people to the truth, especially when we cannot use leaflets or other public methods.

May the God of heaven bless our labours in His service and free us from the constraints of this world.

Sunday gatherings are conducted in the ecclesial meeting place in Seoul and most of those living in isolation throughout South Korea are able to link with this meeting online. The number of Korean young people is very small and one has recently spent a lengthy period of time in South Australia staying with a family with girls of the same age. She was encouraged by the many activities among the young people here and at Heritage College. This impressed her greatly and having now returned home she is following through with Bible instruction towards being baptized.

The South Korean Bible Schools, which are usually held each August, continue to get good support from brothers and sisters from Australia and Canada. These schools have become a yearly event and should you be interested in joining with your Korean brothers and sisters in a Bible School environment where language translation is available, please make contact through the <u>korea@acbm.org.au</u> email account.

There has been only one elderly Mongolian brother residing in or near the capital, Ulaanbaatar for many years—and there has been limited to no contact with him since 2019.

Fieldworkers needed:

Travelling to other countries in our region to support our brothers and sisters is one of the most rewarding activities you can be involved in. However, it is important you obtain as much information as possible about the area you plan to travel to. We recommend you contact other brothers and sisters who have travelled to that area and allow them to share their experiences with you.

You should also contact the Area Team that looks after the area, let them know of your intentions, and find out the areas of need to maximise the benefit of the time you spend there.

The ACBM website contains information you need to consider before committing to become a fieldworker. You can also submit your application from the website.

Online meetings and tutors:

An increasing number of brothers and sisters are supporting the work from home via email, Zoom or Skype. You can connect to online meetings with those in mission areas, or offer to be a tutor to contacts or newly baptised brothers and sisters.

The migration of young people from Fiji due to a limit of job opportunities, is becoming an issue for the ecclesia. Also it is difficult to find partners in the truth.

This places more responsibility and commitment to ecclesial duties and welfare load on those who stay in Fiji. The brothers and sisters would love visits to build each other up as we wait for the return of our Lord.

I first met sister Liti at a youth camp in Fiji in 1989, just after she was baptised. She was an amazing young

person, full of the enthusiasm for life and her Lord. She became one of a band of sisters who became the backbone of the Suva Ecclesia. She struggled with cancer and passed away at only 52. Sister Liti was a talented school teacher and much loved both in the community and ecclesia.

After a difficult six-year period, visits have recommenced to many brothers and sisters across Papua New Guinea. Bro Rex Tomlinson made the arduous visit across the rough seas from Alotau to Goodenough Island for six weeks (30 May to 17 July 2023) to visit Bro Steven Ilewana. Here Bro Steven has traversed the steep mountain slopes carrying Bibles, literature and correspondence course material. There are 175 active contacts on GI (17 have completed the 40 lesson course). Bro Rex also met with our sisters in POM. In June 2024 Bro Paul Duke visited POM, Lae and Alotau.

Significant tribal violence has resulted in tough times for our Lae families. A Sunday School scholar from Bougainville is studying in Lae for 2 years. Bro Joachim is now assisting him and his own daughter with the 'LTBS correspondence course' through Sis Judy Bailye in Adelaide. Bro Paul met Bro Steven in Alotau. He was impressed with Bro Steven's knowledge and support given at three seminars to an appreciative audience of around 50 people each night, all mostly from Goodenough Island.

During the recent quiet years ACBM took the opportunity to fund the building of an ecclesial hall in the mountain village of Paika, which is the most remote ecclesia in the Asia-Pacific. At the end of 2024, Christadelphian Youth from Paika conducted a Youth Camp to the theme "Nehemiah – Let Us Arise and Build". This was held in their newly constructed hall in the middle of the Bougainville jungle. Bro Kevin Nason wrote: "Yes, the hall has made a great thrilling impact in many of the brothers' and sisters' lives. Those living in the Paika area are using every opportunity to use the building with lights, to do their studies and Bible readings."

They loved the experience and met so many amazing people, that they ended up staying 16 months, with multiple visits from other brothers and sisters from NZ and Australia. Since that time, there have been 4 baptisms in Tonga. They have also submitted and had approved a budget for more mission work in Tonga including a "regular heartbeat of visitors" to help and support the small ecclesia and interested friends there. Feeding them not only spiritually from God's word but in practical ways helping to make their daily chores and home life less of a burden. We would love some more able/willing helpers. Tonga Ecclesia is very small but welcoming. They also are good at having extras come along (interested friends). The Sunday School is small but well attended. Now lots of them are teenagers. Sis Talita and Bro Manase are back on the main island, with their three children. It has given the ecclesia a boost in number and in spirit.

Bro Ralph has kept this ecclesia running consistently for years, with excellent support from Bro Dicki, who also acts as a taxi driver for all the drop-offs and pickups, each time they meet together. They are a faithful and diligent duo with great Bible knowledge, consistent attendance and effort, actively teaching the truth. They are resilient, going through a severe cyclone in 2018, and last year, an earthquake and tsunami, which set off a volcano deep under the sea, and covered their land in black ash, ruining food and water supplies. God willing the plan is to get them a hall to meet in. Currently, they meet in a house, but the room is small for the growing numbers. So often they sit outside under the mango tree. Ultimately we would like to have accommodation with a hall, so fieldworkers have an easy base. Please pray for God's hand to be upon His work in taking it forward.

Tragedy

One of the highlights in Tonga was baptizing 3 new sisters into God's family, but sadly, one of those, Vei, took her own life. She had many inner struggles with postnatal depression and a tragic marriage. She was an amazing faithful, and lovely sister, who loved the truth. She now rests awaiting the resurrection. She has left two small children, a 1 year old boy, Levi, and a 4 year old girl, Ane. She has been part of the motivation for bro Zak taking on the role of secretary and forming a new committee, for Tonga.

August 2023 saw the Bible School held at Fote Village on Malaita Island. Studies were led by bro Rod Dawson & bro Isaac Newton. Brothers, sisters and young people from 4 islands attended plus some young people from Brisbane and Adelaide, Australia. This was a most encouraging time for the local members as they are only able to get together once a year. 3 baptisms were conducted at the Bible School.

In May 2024, 8 Solomon Island young people were thrilled to travel to Vanuatu for the South Pacific Youth Conference. They found it very encouraging and made many new friends.

In January 2024 the annual youth conference led by Bro Bob DeVries on the teachings of the Master was held. Some 30 young people attended plus others from Australia. 2 baptisms took place at this time.

Bro Carl Kempster and bro Alan Thompson travelled in early June 2024 to prepare for the June Bible School.

Bre Rod Dawson and Greg Pogson led the studies on the Fruit of the Spirit and themes from Isaiah. We were pleased that 12 other Australians were able to attend and help with running the week. A most enjoyable and encouraging time was had by all who attended, with 3 baptisms taking place. Bro Joe Vaea in Honiara has commenced doing weekly seminars, with an average attendance of 6 interested friends.

Solomon Islands is a less developed country so many of our brothers and sisters face great difficulties that are foreign to us. There is 80% unemployment and just a few Christadelphians have work and that is poorly paid. Corruption is rife and medical facilities are poor. These brothers and sisters require a great deal of support both spiritually and physically.

Personal Mission Story

Bro John Mark Kiere lives on a tiny group of islands, some 600 km southwest of Honiara, the capital. It's extremely isolated and difficult to get to. He was baptized while working in Honiara in 1999 but was wounded and his life threatened during the civil war in 2000. He fled back to his island and has lived there ever since apart from occasional visits to Bible schools. He has been extremely faithful in his preaching and in running a Sunday School for his own and other children. 2 of his students, who have since married, were baptized some years ago. Life is extremely difficult as he is a subsistence farmer. Rats and disease often destroy his crops. Cyclones destroy his fruit trees and on one occasion, his house. To his great joy, recently, 2 of his sons were baptized, making 4 brethren and 1 sister on the island. Bro John Mark runs seminars and believes there will be more baptisms shortly. He has been provided with an electronic tablet, loaded with many studies, lectures, exhorts and hymns to assist in his walk and work in the Truth. He is a great example of patient endurance under difficult circumstances.
